# Alice Ann Click

**C**LICK, Alice Ann, age 91, of Waynesville, passed away Saturday, November 2, 2024, at Brookdale Senior Living in Piqua.

Alice was born February 1, 1933, in Mousie, Kentucky. She was the youngest child of Hiram and Cumine Casebolt Slone. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband of 57 years, Raymond D. Click; brothers, Carlos (Alice) Slone, Marcus (Lillian, Zona) Slone; Edsel Ford Slone (infant); sisters, Prudie (Clinton) Cox, Helen (Travis) Simpson, Bessie (Clyde) Hale, Verna (Kelly) Reed, and Virginia (Charles) Rice.

They briefly lived with Alice's sister, Bessie, until they moved into the little pink house on Carter Drive where she lived for the next 62 years.

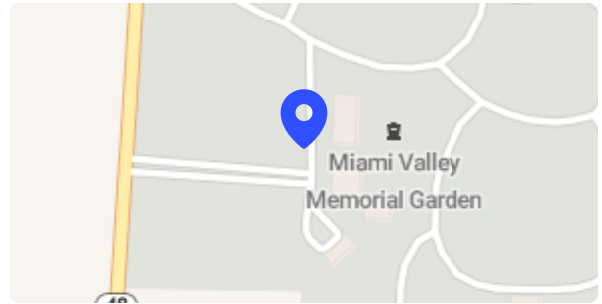
